WASHINGTON – U.S. Representative Robert Aderholt (AL-04) released a statement announcing **Orlando Rodriguez-Valdez**, a 10th grade student at **Fort Payne High School**, as the winner of the 2021 Congressional App Challenge for Alabama's Fourth District.

"It is my honor to announce Orlando Rodriguez-Valdez has the winner of the 2021 Congressional App Challenge from Alabama's Fourth District," said Congressman Aderholt. "Orlando created an app called Cyberstudy. In his entry, Orlando described the app as a way 'to provide a learning experience that actively engages the user in testing their knowledge and learning syntax, terminology, and structure." North Alabama is known as a center for cyber development in America, and Orlando is clearly helping to grow this reputation. I have no doubt big things are in his future."

This app will be featured on <u>CongressionalAppChallenge.us</u> and will also be eligible to have photos of its interface displayed in the U.S. Capitol. A video of Orlando describing his entry can be found here.

The Congressional App Challenge was created by the U.S. House of Representatives in 2015 and allows students to compete against their peers across the country by creating an app for desktop/PC, web, tablet, mobile, raspberry Pi or other devices. The challenge is designed to promote innovation and engagement in computer science.

Mr. Jett announced the Robotic program received a TVA grant for \$5000 and an Intuitive Foundation grant for \$2000.

Mr. Jett updated the Board on the BEAT Center Timeline and the renovations to the Williams Avenue Building, as follows:

- BEAT Center Timeline Bid Process should be completed within the month of February and construction to begin before the end of school.
- Williams Avenue Inside renovation should be finished by end of May and outside renovation by the end of July. We will begin Pre-K classes in August of this year. (9 Pre-K classes)

Mr. Jett discussed the latest COVID numbers with the Board. He also, apologized to the Board and the parents for the short notice regarding the need to go virtual last week. He expressed his appreciation to all the FPCS's staff members for their dedication to their job and the students of this system.

Mr. Jett thanked the board for the partnership between the school board and the city of Fort Payne. The administrative offices of the FPPD will be temporary relocated to the south pods of Williams Avenue School. He stated they FPPD will be totally separated from our Pre-K and High School classes
