The Top 30 8th grade science students will be visiting Southern Research Center on February 13th. Students will gain experience with utilizing sustainable and efficient methods to generate energy through the use of natural, renewable resources, like wind and water. Students will learn about the basics of kinetic and potential energy, the conservation of energy, and the transfer of energy. They will collaborate in groups to design, build, and test either a wind turbine or a water turbine. Students will assess the efficiency of their designs by mathematically calculating the amount of power generated and discuss ways in which their designs can be improved. **ART:** Here's a great way to show your creativity! How to Enter

- 1. Download and print the entry form at doodle4google.com or ask your student's teacher for an entry form.
- On the entry form, students will create their doodles using any material they want, write their 50-word descriptive statement, and you sign your child's form.
- Students can draw the doodle on another sheet of paper, take a digital photo, or scan the doodle and tape it to the official entry form. Just be sure that the tape is clear and the doodle is below the information on the bottom of the entry form.
- 4. Entry forms can be submitted digitally at doodle4google.com as a jpg or png file. Entry forms can also be submitted by mail.
- 5. Mailed submissions must be postmarked by March 18, 2019 and received seven days from postmark deadline at one of these two addresses:
